DSO Beats Tri-State 55+ Senior Baseball league 15-8

The 2009 Delaware Senior Olympics baseball team beat the Tri-State 55+ Senior Baseball League by a resounding 15-8 score behind the complete game pitching of Tom Fede to secure the Gold Medal. Pepe struck out four and did not walk anyone.

DSO President, Rick O'Shaughnessy and Event Coordinators Director, Paul Gaito were on hand to pass out the medals after the grueling contest ended.

DSO Falls Behind Early

Tri-State scored on a two out hit batter in the first inning followed by two singles. They nursed that 1-0 lead into the top of the 4th inning. During that time, Ty Coffield and Bob Corbett each reached on errors and Coffield also drew a walk but the Olympians could not push across a run.

Lewis and Grier Score in 4th to Give Olympians 2-1 Edge

Greg Lewis smoked a one hopper over the third base bag for a double and advanced to third on a throwing error. Willis Grier plated him with a single to tie the game and Willis came around on a passed ball and single to push DSO into the lead 2-1 after four innings.

DSO Big Fifth Inning Takes Lead for Good

DSO pushed across four runs in the top of the fifth to take a 6-1 lead and start their ride to victory. They added a seven run outburst in the 6th and tacked on two more in the seventh. During that time, Ty Coffield walked, singled, and reached on an error. Bob Corbett walked and scored a run. Winning pitcher Tom Fede had two singles and a double with two runs scored. Greg Lewis singled, hit the hardest triple seen in this park for a while (to the fence in left center) and singled again on his way to scoring three runs. His triple cleared the bases to break the game open giving DSO a 9-2 lead. Dom Rodriguez singled and scored a run as did Willis Grier.

Tri-State Narrows Gap but Falls Well Short

The Tri-State squad six runs in the last two innings but they proved to be far too little and far too late. The Olympians walked away with the gold by a final score of 15-8.
